MEET ANDY

Now 19 years old, Andy grew up in Santa Ana, where he remembers facing most of his struggles alongside his mom. Sharing the same living space as two other families was the norm and the only way they could afford a place to live. Their housing situation was short-lived, as one day, they were unexpectedly told to leave. In the face of this new adversity, Andy not only lost the place he called home, but he also lost his mom. She left him to fend for himself, leading him to sleep in friends' cars or couch surfing from one place to the next.

Andy says "StandUp for Kids has helped him become a more responsible version of himself". He started an internship with Imperial Sprinkler Supply (ISS) and later secured a full-time job. Andy's life has changed for the better. He is now in StandUp for Kids Rapid Rehousing Program, which helped him find an apartment that he shares with two roommates. Finally, he has a place he can call his own.

MEET HONEY

Honey, a 17-year-old high school graduate, who recently acquired housing through StandUp for Kids, has only been with the program for three weeks. In just a short time, she said that she has gained a new outlook on life, with her mentors guiding her to stay true to her commitments, budgeting and planning.

Before StandUp for Kids, Honey lacked support in every aspect of her life. From the age of 12, basic necessities became scarce in the home. The hot water, AC and WiFi would often get shut off and she became responsible for preparing her own meals, even though there was little food in the home.

Honey looks forward to becoming self-sufficient and has goals for the future. She has found a job as a swim instructor beginning mid-April, is looking for a room to rent for when she turns 18, and plans on joining cosmetology school.

Thanks to your support, Honey is in a safe and stable place now with a bright future ahead of her.

Then one day out of the blue her life was shattered. Due to the pandemic, Zoey lost both her jobs. She couldn't pay her rent, buy food or keep the lights on. Then what she feared most, she was evicted from her apartment.

Zoey was homeless, alone and terrified.

DYSFUNCTION THAT LED TO A CALLING

One of 13, as a child in New York, Justine recalls living in a dysfunctional household, witnessing the consequences of alcoholism, and having to take on adult roles while her mother worked.

When she left home at 16, she never expected to end up in an unhealthy marriage. She later adopted her son's brother, sparking an underlying interest in helping youth.

THE INTERNSHIP THAT STARTED IT ALL

After getting divorced, Justine returned to school for what she thought would be an Associate degree but earned her Bachelor's in Human Services and became a certified recovery coach.

Knowing that she wanted to help youth experiencing homelessness, Justine sought out a nonprofit for her internship and discovered StandUp For Kids.

Once the internship was over, Justine realized she had found her purpose and decided to stay on as a volunteer.

UNWAVERING COMMITMENT

Over the last 16 years, Justine has grown a small team of 3 conducting street outreach to over 100 volunteers and 9 staff members.

A volunteer for 11 of those years, her compassion, commitment, and genuine concern for youth experiencing homelessness and atrisk youth shines through.

With her leadership in 2021, StandUp For Kids provided more than 4,500 meals, 1,559 nights of shelter, and 474 youth were supported.
