### We're back in schools!!

We're excited to announce that our Road Map to Success Program (RMTS) launched this fall in four high schools in three school districts. The RMTS program is an in-school mentoring program focusing on supporting students, ages 12 to 18, who are at-risk of or experiencing homelessness. The program's goal is to increase high school graduation rates and college entry.

Did you know? Homeless students are 87% more likely to drop out of school altogether vs. housed students

#### Did you know?

Young adults with less than GED were **4.5x** more likely to report experiencing homelessness than peers who competed high school
